

## CAMP SITE REGULATIONS

§ 1. On arrival campers must register with the camp manager or person in charge. They must state home address and show identification papers.

Charges are to be paid in accordance with specified fees.

§ 2. Campers must observe instructions received and they are obliged to learn the regulations concerning fire, gas etc.

§ 3. Tents and camping-equipment should be of normal appropriate design and quality. Fences, platforms or other personal installations than tents and caravans are prohibited without permission from site manager or owner. Digging must not take place.

§ 4. Dogs must be kept on leash and must be exercised outside the campsite.

Owing to risk of rabies, it is forbidden to bring animals into Norway.

§ 5. Consideration toward fellow campers, visitors and neighbours of the campsite is essential.

Driving of motor vehicles is allowed only between entrance and camper's assigned tent space.

Campers must maintain good order and cleanliness on the assigned tent space.

Radio sets, TV and musical instruments are to be used with care and consideration, i.e. low volume during the daytime and absolute silence from 2300 hours to 0700 hours.

Ballgames must not be practised close to tent spaces. Football is only allowed where ball grounds are provided.

Any use of firearms is prohibited, also games and/or exercises that may involve danger or cause annoyance.

Tradesmen on campsites must have written authorisation from the camp manager or owner.

§ 6. Refuse may only be placed in the receptacles provided. Washing of cars, personal washing, clothes washing, dishwashing and rinsing is only allowed on spaces reserved for these purposes and never near drinking water sources.

§ 7. The camp manager or owner, and/or employees of the campsite do not assume any responsibility for campers' and visitors' personal belongings. In the event of damage being caused on the campsite such damage must be compensated by the person or persons responsible.

§ 8. On departure the space occupied must be clean and tidy. Departure 1400 hours at the latest.

§ 9. Following official regulations of December 28th 1966 must be kept:

- Guests in state of intoxication or of improper or noisy behaviour are to be expelled from the grounds, when necessary by the police. This also applies to guests who omit using lavatory conveniences of the camp or otherwise pollute the grounds.

- Quietness is expected between 2300 hours and 0700 hours. The police may in special cases permit a postponement of closing hours beyond 2300 hours for entertainments open to all guests.
